Work with your child to develop letter and numeral identification skills by pointing out the letters in their name, and numerals on your home!

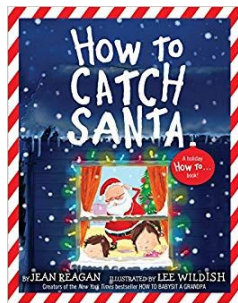
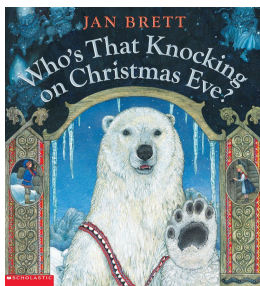
Donations
